Dear Chairman Yarmuth:

I write in response to your June 29, 2020, letter to Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Alex M. Azar II regarding providing to the Government Accountability Office (GAO) appropriate access to information in the course of its ongoing review related to the World Health Organization. Please know that HHS remains committed to accommodating GAO in this review, as well as the more than 360 currently open audits GAO has with the Department. The co-signers of your letter will receive an identical response.

HHS has worked with GAO through the accommodations process as GAO fulfills its statutory obligations. As Secretary Azar testified before the House Select Subcommittee on the Coronavirus Crisis on October 2, HHS is "working with GAO to assist them in fulfilling their responsibilities without negatively affecting the Department's lifesaving mission during this historic pandemic and we remain committed to working with and accommodating GAO in its COVID-19 related work."¹ HHS is working diligently to accommodate GAO in fulfilling its statutory obligations consistent with available resources, while preserving longstanding Executive Branch interests, and minimizing interruptions to the lifesaving mission of OWS.
