5 Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is amend-

18 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than March 1 of 19 the first session of a Congress, or upon the request 20 of the Committee on the Budget of the House of 21 Representatives or the Senate, each committee of 22 the House of Representatives and the Senate having 23 legislative jurisdiction shall submit to its respective 24 Committee on the Budget its views and estimates

1	(as determined by the committee making such sub-
2	mission) with respect to the following:
3	"(A) Any legislation to be considered dur-
4	ing that Congress that is a priority for the com-
5	mittee.
6	"(B) Any legislation within the jurisdiction
7	of the committee that would establish, amend,
8	or reauthorize any Federal program and likely
9	have a significant budgetary impact.
10	"(2) Additional matters.—Any committee of
11	the House of Representatives or the Senate and any
12	joint committee of the Congress may submit to the
13	appropriate Committees on the Budget its views and
14	estimates with respect to all matters set forth in
15	subsections (a) and (b) which relate to matters with-
16	in its jurisdiction.
17	"(3) JOINT ECONOMIC COMMITTEE.—The Joint
18	Economic Committee shall submit to the Committees
19	on the Budget of both Houses its recommendations
20	as to the fiscal policy appropriate to the goals of the
21	Employment Act of 1946.".
22	SEC. 202. ANNUAL SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET SUBMISSION
23	BY THE PRESIDENT.
24	Section 1106 of title 31, United States Code, is
25	amended by adding at the end the following:

"(d) On or before December 1 of each calendar year,
the President shall submit to Congress an administrative
budget for the fiscal year beginning in the ensuing calendar year, which shall include up-to-date estimates for
current year and prior year data and credit reestimates
for the current year (as included in the Federal credit supplement of such budget).".

8 SEC. 203. HEARING ON THE FISCAL STATE OF THE NATION.

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 45 days (excluding 10 Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays) after the date on which the Secretary of the Treasury submits to Congress the au-11 12 dited financial statement required under paragraph (1) of 13 section 331(e) of title 31, United States Code, on a date agreed upon by the chairs of the Committees on the Budg-14 15 et of the House of Representatives and the Senate and the Comptroller General of the United States, the chairs 16 17 shall conduct a hearing to receive a presentation from the 18 Comptroller General reviewing the findings of the audit required under paragraph (2) of such section and pro-19 20 viding, with respect to the information included by the 21 Secretary in the report accompanying such audited finan-22 cial statement, an analysis of the financial position and 23 condition of the Federal Government, including financial 24 measures (such as the net operating cost, income, budget 25 deficits, or budget surpluses) and sustainability measures $1 \$ (such as the long-term fiscal projection or social insurance

- 2 projection) described in such report.
- 3 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The requirement under sub4 section (a) shall apply with respect to any audited finan5 cial statement submitted on or after the date of the enact-
- 6 ment of this Act.
